Ivyland "Grid" Residents Street Closure and Parking Notice for Saturday June 24th




As you may be aware, Saturday June 24th is **Ivyland's Big 150th Anniversary celebration**. As part of the preparation for our various events and visitors **there will be some street closures beginning on or about 9:30 AM on Saturday with some closures lasting until about 9:00 PM when we expect the Warminster Symphony Orchestra concert to be completed and our visitors gone on their way.**

Below is a basic map of the event area and street closures which will have typical saw horse barricades with some key intersections being monitored by the Fire Police.

We realize that these closures may cause an inconvenience to some of our residents and we apologize for that. But in order to ensure the safety of visitors and the space for our various event attractions, it is a necessary precaution.

Please review the specific closure notices for your street on the back. Note that the eastmost blocks of Willard, Wilson, Gough and Lincoln will be open from Twining to Jacksonville Rd. Twining Ave. will be open but with **no parking posted** so remove any vehicles from the street. Chase Ave. will be completely open from Jacksonville to Greeley. Greeley will be open from Chase to Bristol.



Ivyland "Grid" Road Closure and Parking Recap for Saturday June 24th

For those residents on a closed street who anticipate needing to leave after 9:30 AM Sat. June 24th, you can relocate your vehicle to a remote parking lot:

- o Finisher Fitness/Creative Environments lot
- Berger Bros. lot off Jacksonville (can get back to borough by walking via grass area behind the Borough hall parking spots that connects to the Berger Bros. lot)
- Milton Roy parking lot there will be a designated area. Golf cart shuttle to and from lot starting at 11AM
- Anytime from Friday June 23rd evening to Saturday June 24th 9AM

Saturday June 24th

- 9:30AM Street Closures Begin (see map)
- All vehicles must be off streets on closed sections of Pennsylvania Avenue, Wilson Avenue,
 Gough Avenue, DuBois Ave.
- Twining Avenue will not be closed to traffic but no vehicles can be parked on the street.
- Lincoln Avenue park vehicles off street if possible. If you must use street parking, use just the side of the street closest to Bristol Road if you are between Greeley and Dubois. Be sure to park facing in the correct direction. The Horse and Wagon route will use Lincoln Ave. between Greeley and Dubois and it needs the extra space. Thanks.
- Greeley no parking in street
- Vehicles parked in Finisher Fitness lot can exit by railroad tracks and turn left down Ivyland Rd.
- Returning vehicles to Finisher Fitness Lot use Ivyland Rd. and let Fire Police at barrier know you are an Ivyland resident and are using the remote lot.
- 9PM roads reopen (Gough and Lincoln may reopen a bit earlier). Once open, normal street parking can resume

If you have an unanticipated need to leave from a closed street – here are some guidelines.

- 1. If you are in a closed but high pedestrian traffic area such as Gough or Wilson, ask a volunteer (bright green shirt) or go to the Information booth by the playground so Fire Police can be called to assist. Please only if it is absolutely necessary to leave.
- 2. If you are in a low pedestrian traffic area (parts of Lincoln, DuBois and Pennsylvania between Gough and Chase) you can carefully self-exit to Greeley (right turn only) or to Chase Ave. You may need to move a barricade enough to allow your vehicle past, but then please pull over and move the barricade back. Follow the same process on your return do not use Ivyland Rd. unless parking in the Finisher Fitness/Creative Environments lot.
- 3. Please only do this if truly necessary. There will be some pedestrian traffic on those sections for the Walking Tour and the Horse and Wagon route goes through these streets as well so be cautious and careful.

Again we apologize for any inconvenience, but these events are once every 25 years and we hope you understand that. We also hope that you enjoy the many great activities that we have planned for the day.
